

GRC POSTER INSTRUCTIONS

1. Poster presenters should have their displays arranged by either 9:30 AM or 1:30 PM. Morning Session presentations should be removed by 12:00 PM to allow Afternoon Session presenters time to arrange their displays.
2. Draw a rough sketch of your poster first. Our poster boards are 4' X 6'.
3. When in doubt, edit out. Crowded, clustered posters are difficult to read and are often disregarded. Remember to make sure every item in your poster is necessary. Your poster should stimulate discussion. Keep your text to a minimum. Your emphasis should be on graphics, charts, graphs, and photos. Save what you might put in text for discussions with your colleagues or the judges.
4. A reproduction of the abstract placed in the upper left side of the poster is suggested, as are Introduction and Summary or Conclusions sections of your poster.
5. The presenting author should be at the assigned space during the designated time to discuss work presented. The author should also note the time that the judges are expected and be present for the discussion.
6. Be sure to bring thumbtacks or pins, as they are not provided at the poster session. Please do not stick any pins in the wood outside the boards.

JUDGING CRITERIA

All presentations will be judged according to the following criteria:

1. Identification of the hypothesis or question.
2. Appropriate experimental design
3. Ability to answer questions
4. Clear presentation of data
5. Interpretation of results
6. Overall impression of presenter and presentation
